

## 1 Homework

Six problems are graded each week. Each graded problem is worth 1 point: to receive the point, the problem must be correct. That is, no committing-two-errors-and-coming-back-to-the-right-track magic trick shall be permitted. All numerical answers, moreover, must be simplified. The rest of the problem set is graded based on the number of problems completed; up to 4 points can be earned from this portion of the homework.

## 2 Quizzes

All problems in any given quiz are graded. To receive full credit, you must show all work, viz. all crucial steps of the solution—there are invariably a few in each problem—must be correct and clearly presented. This is very important, as only 1 or 2 points, in general, are awarded to a right answer without satisfactory justification. Simplifying numerical answers, such as rationalizing the denominator, is required, although the penalty for leaving the correct answer unsimplified is never heavy.

## 3 Extra Credit Assignments

All problem sets under the title *Supplementary Notes* are considered as extra-credit assignments. All problems in the set is graded, each of which worth 1 point. No partial credit shall be awarded for any given problem.
